

# New Jersey Fire-EMS Training

## Online NFPA-Based Courses & OEMS-Approved EMS CE to Help Meet Training Requirements

---

The **New Jersey Division of Fire Safety** does not mandate Continuing Education (CE) for Firefighter I and II. CE hours are due at the discretion of the local fire department. Fire Instructors and Fire Investigators in New Jersey are required to complete 15 hours of CE every 3 years.

The **NJ Department of Health (NJ DOH) - Office of Emergency Medical Services (OEMS)** requires 48 hours of CE triennially for EMTs and biennially for Paramedics, based on initial licensure date. OEMS requires all courses to be pre-approved. It is the responsibility of the licensee to verify that courses meet the requirements of their Clinical Coordinator or Medical Director.
